Description: An interesting idea to indulge children in pretend play activities is to give them the required materials (as mentioned) and ask them to decorate it like a home. Ask the students to use the cardboard and cut it in the shape of a house using the scissors, use color papers for decorating the walls, ceiling and floors, and use toys for decorating as they desire. Glue is provided for sticking the materials in place. Fairy lights for lighting up the house.

- increase skills of practical life

| Grouping: 5 children for each tub | Additional support: one adult per group of 5 children |

Description:

The toy animals will be placed in the tub of shaving foam and aprons and a tray will be kept next to it with tongs and a net. The children will be guided and encouraged to take out as many toy animals out of the tub as they can, especially through using the tools provided and place them on the tray

Learning Objectives:

- improving gross motor skills
- increasing knowledge about the different animals
- developing their group work ability and socialization skills
- cognitive development
